MEETING #3 – 16 April 2025

The following topics were discussed at the April meeting of the Mt Buller Stakeholder Consultative Committee.

Mt Buller discussion points

Mt Buller Update

- Boggy Creek dam is at 32% capacity, surpassing last year's levels. Contractors are working on the Sun Valley fill line to send water to Sun Valley dam when turbidity is too high to fill Boggy Creek dam.
- A government grant of \$830K has been received for 10km of new mountain bike trails, enhancing the network and creating more beginner terrain.
- Amenity upgrades include additional seating in Alpine Plaza, four new toilet cubicles at Cielas and refurbished toilets throughout the site.
- The inaugural Billy Cart Bash was a success with positive feedback and media coverage, hoping to become a regular Green Season event.

Stakeholder Priority List

The stakeholder priority list was reviewed, including the status and ARV's view on each priority. There was also a discussion on the future of the Southern Resorts and the ongoing expression of interest process.

ARV Discussion Points

Strategic Plan Engagement Approach

The Alpine Resorts Strategic Plan (ARSP) is a five-year plan mandated by legislation. It will outline long-term objectives and principles as well as recognise challenges and opportunities. The plan requires engaging various stakeholders, including consultative committees, traditional owner groups and local organisations likely to be affected by the plan. The ARV engagement strategy focuses on active communication, stakeholder involvement and transparency, aiming to shift the plan's perception from government-led to a sector-wide initiative. The timeline includes a webinar and five in-person workshops in May, with the draft plan hoping to be finalised by October. The process includes 10-14 hours of direct engagement, with additional rounds for SCCs to review the draft and final plans.
