MEETING #6 – 15 October 2025

The following topics were discussed at the October meeting of the Mt Stirling Stakeholder Consultative Committee.

Mt Stirling discussion points

Operations Update

Winter visitation reached nearly 14,500, double the 10-year average and 76% above the average for visitor days. The season was approximately 50% longer than in 2024, with similar road clearing and chain fitting days, increased tobogganing and shuttle use, more snow grooming and higher diesel consumption due to extended operations and reduced battery capacity. Preliminary visitor survey results showed skiing as the dominant activity, followed by snow play, with school groups significantly influencing trends. Post-winter plans include track and culvert maintenance, road works, flora management at Mirimbah and upkeep of the environmental offset.

Future of Mt Stirling

The discussion around the future operational model continued. Following our previous conversations with stakeholders, there has been further internal review and consideration of the stakeholder feedback received. Staff consultation has commenced, with employees reviewing the potential impacts and providing feedback to inform decision-making.
