



**MT STIRLING STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE (SCC)
MEETING #1 – 10 February 2026**

The following topics were discussed at the February meeting of the Mt Stirling Stakeholder Consultative Committee.

Mt Stirling Discussion Points

Operations Update

- The removal of public rubbish collection has increased waste pressure at Mirimbah.
- There is temporary reliance on the diesel generator after lightning damaged the hydroelectric system in December.
- Several initiatives were proposed to strengthen visitor revenue ahead of winter, including paid camping, improved point-of-sale facilities and new products and services, particularly for school groups.
- Essential winter services will be maintained in 2026 with patrol staffing focused on the peak ten-week winter period.

Mt Stirling Resort Strategic Plan

Stakeholders reviewed a draft template for a resort plan to confirm it captured all key topics, noting the particular importance of environmental stewardship and climate adaptation. The Mount Stirling 2030 Plan was also reviewed, with agreement that most objectives remain relevant and provide a strong foundation for the new plan, although there was a desire for clearer, timebound goals to strengthen accountability, with stakeholder input central to the process.
