



**MT STIRLING STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE (SCC)
MEETING #2 – 21 April 2026**

The following topics were discussed at the April meeting of the Mt Stirling Stakeholder Consultative Committee.

Mt Stirling Discussion Points

Operations Update

Green season visitation is tracking slightly below last year, although school group visitation remains strong. Operational priorities continue to focus on asset maintenance, environmental outcomes and winter readiness, including:

- Repairs to the hydroelectric system have restored functionality and increased generation capacity by around 25%, reducing reliance on diesel over winter.
- Car park works are progressing to expand capacity beyond the 200 spaces achieved last year.
- Replacement of ageing infrastructure such as hut fireplaces and batteries at Telephone Box Junction.
- Community service programs with Geelong Grammar School and Lauriston College have been confirmed for May to support prewinter works.

Mirimbah Boundaries

A review of legislative boundary mapping confirmed that Mirimbah is within the Mt Buller resort boundary.

Mt Stirling Resort Strategic Plan

Development of the Mt Stirling Resort Management Plan has commenced, with the SCC undertaking early collaborative work on the vision statement, environmental values and environmental priorities using an online engagement tool. Remaining sections of the plan will be progressed through future SCC meetings, alongside a broader stakeholder workshop planned for May or early June.
