



**MT STIRLING STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE (SCC)
MEETING #3 – 16 April 2025**

The following topics were discussed at the April meeting of the Mt Stirling Stakeholder Consultative Committee.

Mt Stirling discussion points

Operations Update

Visitor numbers are slightly down compared to previous years. Pre-winter projects include re-sheeting the Telephone Box Junction lower car park, improving roads, transitioning to electric systems, and managing the Mirimbah sycamore infestation. The environmental offset has received positive feedback, with ongoing pest control work. Winter plans involve operating a second toboggan park, increasing car parking capacity, collaborating with Stirling Experience for school visits, and improving signage to enhance the guest experience and accommodate more visitors.

Results of Stakeholder Engagement Survey

The response rate to the survey has been limited and participants are encouraged to complete it to help identify desired engagement levels across six areas of stakeholder work. Definitions of engagement levels were discussed, and examples will be provided via email to help clarify them.

ARV Discussion Points

Strategic Plan Engagement Approach

- Alpine Resorts Strategic Plan (ARSP): A five-year plan outlining long-term objectives, principles, challenges, opportunities, and specific actions.
- Consultation Requirements: Engaging various stakeholders including traditional owner groups, municipal councils, and local organizations.
- Engagement and Collaboration: Emphasis on active communication, stakeholder involvement, and transparency. Mosaic Labs reappointed to facilitate collaboration.
- Timeline: Facilitator appointed in March, with webinars and workshops planned for May/June. Final plan aimed for Ministerial approval in October.
