



MT BULLER STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE (SCC)

MEETING #3 – 25 June 2026

The following topics were discussed at the June meeting of the Mt Buller Stakeholder Consultative Committee.

Ministerial Changes

Recent Ministerial portfolio changes affecting the Alpine Resorts were outlined. Despite the reset, progress has continued on priority initiatives, including securing \$5 million in funding for alpine water infrastructure upgrades. The committee discussed opportunities to strengthen government and stakeholder engagement, noted delays to ARV Board appointments and welcomed the continuation of operational funding through a Letter of Comfort.

Mt Buller Operations Update

The operational update highlighted successful grant funding for the Village Square paving project and the completion of mountain bike trail upgrades. Ongoing work on the Resort Management Plan was noted, with strong stakeholder engagement and discussion on the importance of incorporating diverse perspectives and supporting data into future planning. The update also outlined measures being implemented to respond to current snow conditions and enhance the visitor experience.

Mount Buller Chamber of Commerce Goals & Advocacy

The Chamber of Commerce outlined its role in representing commercial operators and advocating for governance, funding and investment outcomes that support the long-term sustainability of Mt Buller.

Mt Buller Resort Management Plan

The Resort Management Plan workshop focused on identifying and prioritising visitor experience challenges, with key themes including accessibility, transport, road access, public amenities, village activation and wayfinding. Members also completed a SWOT analysis to help shape future strategic directions and inform development of the draft Resort Management Plan.

Budget Engagement Session

The budget engagement session explored stakeholder priorities, funding assumptions and long-term financial sustainability. Key themes included the need for a demand-led approach to asset investment, greater transparency around revenue and cost allocation, and consideration of the impacts of site rentals and service charges on stakeholders. Members also participated in a service prioritisation exercise to help inform future funding decisions.
